5:25pm. VII. Executive Director's Report

- East End Community School (EECS) Face-to-face learning with two separate groups, one group attends Monday/Tuesday the other Thursday/Friday with virtual learning on Wednesday.
- Lyman Moore Middle School (LMMS) Three students and all are face-to-face four days a week with one virtual learning day.
- Portland High School (PHS) Face-to-face learning with two separate groups, one group attends Monday/Tuesday the other Thursday/Friday with virtual learning on Wednesday.
 - o PHS has taken a virtual approach for all of their students with the exception of freshman
 - They have been wonderful in allowing our students to attend 4 days a week
- If a Portland Public School parents asks for remote only that means that child joins the Remote Academy only which is provided by the teachers who have accommodations to work from home. This means our student(s) would have a mainstream teacher and not their homeroom teacher. Remote Academy is actually a separate school for PPS with the exception of the high school.
- Preschool is going full force, all direct education and aftercare is still in place
- 10% of staff requested and were approved for some type of accommodation, including medical, and two accessing the Family First Coronavirus Response Act
- COVID precautions heavily followed at all locations with daily check-ins of staff, students and parents

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- Staff is ready if our color changes to code red
 - o Staff really stepped up in March
 - o They took the challenge and embraced it
- Two new open Director positions posted on our website (www.mecdhh.org): Director of Deaf Education, position vacated by Rebecca Falbo January 1, 2021; and Director of Early Intervention and Family Engagement (position vacated by Karen Hopkins, January 1, 2021)
- With the placement of two new directors we are look to restructuring the coordinator positions in a way to provide more support to the directors
 - More information on the coordinator positions will be presented at the November meeting
- Host family scenario is working really well with Lisa and Jeff Lederer providing a wonderful home environment for our 2 students
- New Hampshire grant Annual Report: Karen Hopkins, Director of Statewide Education and Family Services
 - Working with the Department of Labor (DOL) with three other state agencies and looking a Vermont, Maine and New Hampshire becoming more collaborative
 - o National standards to ensure our curriculum is developed in a strong way to meet the needs of all students in Maine
 - o Incorporating families along with the deaf community
 - Plan is for the grant to continue and look at the research and local programs:
 Portland program, Brewer program, how to serve all regions in our state. Best practices for all regions, tapping into how it's working in New Hampshire

- Portland Public Schools schedule for K-12, Rebecca Falbo, Director of Deaf Education and Mainstream Programming
 - o The East End Community School students and staff are separated into 2 groups. Each group attends school in person 2-days a week and receives remote learning on the remaining day.

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- All 3 Lyman Moore Middle School students participate for the 4 days that the school is open. Two of those days they attend mainstream classes. The remaining 2 days they participate in virtual classes and utilize our staff for support.
- Currently, 6 students are attending Portland High School 4 days a week from 8:00am to 1:00pm. Students attending mainstream courses are participating virtually (Remote School) with support from MECDHH/GBSD staff. Classes are 40 minutes long. Bag lunches are provided by PPS schools and are consumed in their classrooms.

Staff member Amy Spencer, one of our Speech Language Pathologists and a Teacher of the Deaf, has become a certified Listening and Spoken Language Specialist (LSLS). This is an AG Bell certification. There are only two in the state of Maine. The goal of a LISL specialist would be to work on spoken language training focusing on the listening and speech component without any type of lip reading or visual cues. We know our students benefit from facial expressions, from pointing, from lip movements but it can be challenging to do both at the same time, ASL and supporting visual cues.

Amy can support with language and spoken language and AS, this is a gift for a family as they explore language opportunities with the child.
